The money is part of the company's Chalkboard Grants that started in 2009. Every year Cascade Community sets aside money to be used by teachers who need supplies to conduct creative classroom projects. This year, Brooklyn Edera received money to support the foods program. Edera plans to use her grant money to purchase supplies for the home economics program that was revived last year. Her goal is to continue to strengthen the program and expand it using money from the High School Success Act grant.

Jannelle Wilde also received a CCCU Chalkboard grant to buy map reading equipment for her Natural Resource classes. This is in addition to the \$125,000 revitalization grant from the state of Oregon.

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
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Nutrition is an important part of any child's

This past week Douglas County Environmental Health did a surprise inspection of the school nutrition program. The inspection included cleanliness, food quality, food temperatures and a variety of other areas relating to food service nutrition. The inspection found NO violations in any of the observable areas mentioned. This was an incredible moment for the YSD nutrition program. Head cook Melissa Peterson has taken control of the previously fragile program and put into place many standards that have helped to move the program forward. Because of this, students have commented on how much better the food is this year. With Peterson running the program, the YSD school nutrition program is in good hands.





FAFSA— For seniors only. FAFSA is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The FAFSA is FREE and helps students access grants and federal loans to help pay for college or technical school. The FAFSA determines student's eligibility for financial aid, and all students who plan on attending any college (including CSM!), trade, or technical school should be filling out the FAFSA!

Delta Kappa Gamma Awards Grant to Natural Resource Program

The Perkins Grant, which supports CTE (Career and Technical Education), did not cover all of the soil equipment wanted for the Natural Resources program. Getting the equipment specialist use in their work is an expensive process. DKG stepped up and granted the NR program \$200 for another piece of soil testing equipment.

With the money from DKG, a purchase of a soil calibration kit will be added to the school's soil equipment, allowing students to evaluate soil more accurately and be able to tell the difference between silt, sand, and clay and variations of the three.
