Increasing student attendance has been a top priority at Yoncalla High School since our return from COVID. Over the last few years, staff has been working hard to make connections and build relationships with students and families along with celebrating attendance growth and recognizing students for their hard work.

At the beginning of November, we had our first attendance celebration of the year and were able to recognize 97 students for having attendance at 90% or above with an Ice Cream Sundae Bar. This was a major celebration. We purchased 17 half-gallons of ice cream and we ran out! This was the largest Ice Cream Sundae Bar we have had since we started doing this two years ago and I am so proud of the attendance gains students and families continue to make.

While we teachers, administrators, and counselors can offer student support and programs to improve attendance, it is <u>you</u> who makes all the difference in ensuring your student comes to school regularly and we thank you for all your hard work and support.

Here are some attendance highlights from Quarter 1: 88% of students at YHS attended school 90% or more of the time

Each grade level average was above 90% $\ \square$

Grade 7: 96.6% Grade 8: 94.6% Grade 9: 95.9% Grade 10: 90.8% Grade 11: 94.4%

Grade 12: 96.5%

100% of the 9th grade class had 90% or better attendance in August/September.

100% of the 7th grade class had 90% or better attendance in October.







Grants for Science Equipment


Financial Aid Night
