

district meetings that are scheduled. This project should complete the renovation of the Board Room modular, and help the district check off one more task from the shortening list to do's!!



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Ms Edera's Class Warms Up the Teachers




Final Roof Repair at YHS

It involves the roofs that have been mentioned along with the two skylights in the resource room. Once this process is finished, all the roofs at both buildings will be good moving forward. The next roof scheduled for repair is on the bus barn. Depending on the budget, this roof is scheduled for repair next summer based on the YSD maintenance plan.




The Calming Flower

The Yoncalla School District has had an Indian Education Program since 2004. Each year we ask parents to take advantage of the services offered by the program. Our funding is provided by a grant from the Office of Indian Education and these funds

enable us to work with Indian students to provide academic assistance and meet cultural needs. The program is open to Native students grades Pre-K-12th grade. Activities include storytelling, crafting, and tribal history. Summer camp

opportunities, drumming, and traditional gardening techniques are offered pending COVID-19 regulations. No percentage requirements or tribal enrollment necessary but the child must have Native ancestry.
