Glide Revitalization recently contacted the Natural Resource teacher, Ms. Wilde, and asked if the school might be interested in an opportunity to help replant trees in the areas up the Umpqua River that were devastated by the Archie Creek fires two years ago. Ms. Wilde jumped at the opportunity and gathered students for the task. The students will earn money, credit, and work experience. A few properties were worked on this fall but the bulk of the work will come in January and February when the young trees will be ready for the ground.

“This is a great chance for students to demonstrate their soft skills of being on time, talking to landowners, and demonstrating a strong work ethic,” said Ms. Wilde about the chance to

work up the Umpqua. The workers also learn about reforestation and fire at the same time.

Everyone’s looking forward to Mr. McHaffie’s class in dutch over cooking during Eagle Exploration.




Yoncalla School District Priorities

For the last two years, Yoncalla Schools has felt an absence amongst the needs of its students – counseling. After some false starts over this time period, we are so incredibly happy to announce that Ms. Kari Campbell is joining the Yoncalla staff as Counselor starting November 28th!

Ms. Kari, who is supervised by Compass Behavioral Health, will be in our district full time and available to see students Mondays and Wednesdays at the elementary school and Thursdays and Thursdays at the high school.

Ms. Kari completed her Masters in Counseling Psychology at Robert Morris University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. During her training and professional experiences, she has worked with a variety of diagnoses including substance abuse disorders, depression, anxiety, and supporting people through medical diagnoses such as liver cancer. While most of her experience is in providing adult services, she is enthusiastic about the opportunity to work with youth and families. In her work, Ms. Kari focuses on Cognitive Behavioral Therapy or CBT as her primary therapeutic approach but recognizes that everyone is different so no two approaches will be the same.
