Hand Washing	<ul> <li>Good hand hygiene is expected and encouraged for all staff and students who enter each building, every day:</li> <li>Continue all recommendations from Yoncalla Communicable Disease Plan pp 4-7.</li> <li>Wash with soap and water for 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with 60-95% alcohol.</li> <li>Hand washing is also required before every meal and after restroom use.</li> <li>Implementation of routine hand washing, before/during/after preparing food, before/after eating, before/after caring for someone who is sick, before/after using the restroom or, after blowing your nose/coughing/sneezing, breakfast/lunch, PE, music and more.</li> <li>Staff will teach proper handwashing and covering coughs etiquette at both buildings.</li> <li>Adequate handwashing supplies and access will be available.</li> <li>Access to hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol for use. Hand sanitizers will be stored up, away, and out of sight of younger children and will be used only with adult supervision for children ages 5 years and younger.</li> <li>Post signs as well as model and teach to students. Visual directions and posters are posted at both schools about hand washing as well as cough etiquette.</li> </ul>
Cleaning and Disinfection	<ul> <li>The custodial staff at YSD will routinely clean and disinfect following the CDC cleaning and disinfecting guidance.</li> <li>Continue all recommendations from Yoncalla Communicable Disease Plan pp 4-7.</li> </ul>
