

North Douglas County Child and Adolescent Immunization Event

WHO: Umpqua Community Health Center (UCHC)

WHAT: Child and adolescent immunizations

WHEN: Thursday, February 7, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

WHERE: 316 West A Avenue, Drain, OR

WHY: Immunizations (also called vaccinations) protect people from deadly diseases like measles and chickenpox that over the years have claimed millions of lives.

In Oregon, school-age children and teens are required to have up-to-date immunizations to attend school. Starting Wednesday, February 20 (Exclusion Day), students who have not submitted to their school proper immunization paperwork will not be able to attend class.



Parents or guardians may submit appropriate documentation of immunization at any time on or after Exclusion Day and their children will immediately be allowed back in school.
